This week in Year 6 we have been writing scary stories, looking in particular at creating an atmosphere using dialogue. We wrote playscripts and short stories and looked at the differences between the two types of text.

In maths lessons this week, we are now looking at multiplication. We have looked at a range of ways to multiply using mental and written methods, as well as putting multiplication into a context using multi-step questions.

In the afternoons, the class have written their own version of the Ten Commandments, discussed E-safety and have learned how to access and use a defibrillator safely in an emergency. Thank you to the parents who visited us on our Book Look afternoon. It was great to show you all of our hard work and we hope you enjoyed the experience.

Next term we are looking forward to:
