

This week in Year 6 we have been learning how to answer reasoning questions involving co-ordinates, such as translations of shapes and predicting missing co-ordinates within a quadrant. In English lessons, we have been writing our own non-fiction newspaper articles, using the passive voice and our own opinions.

In the afternoons, the class have moved onto learning about the rise and fall of the British Empire, focusing on the 19th Century and how it affected the monarchy's power. We have designed and made Indian prints on cotton, mimicking the method used in the 19th Century in India.

Next week we are looking forward to:

- Writing a playscript inspired by our 'Harry Potter' book this term.
- Revising our knowledge of measurement conversions in maths.
- Measuring angles accurately using a protractor.
- Discussing the abdication crisis of the 20th Century and reviewing the last thousand years of the British monarchy.
