This week in Year 6 we have been revising fractions and decimals in our maths lessons, as well as finding the difference between positive and negative numbers. In English lessons, the children have designed their own products and have been writing an explanation text to promote them.

In the afternoons, we have 'blocked' our lessons this term and this week we have spent several afternoons studying PSHE, which this term focuses on staying safe and understanding responsibility. In these lessons, we have discussed the changes that children might encounter in 2018, in particular their new schools.

Hate Crime Workshop

The children really enjoyed and learnt a lot from the Racism and Hate Crime workshop on Wednesday. The workshop covered the definition of racism, appropriate terms to describe someone's ethnicity (black, Asian or white) and a range of scenarios detailing hate crimes were discussed. Shona (the workshop leader from Show Racism the Red Card) ensured the children understood that the classroom was a safe place where any question could be asked so that knowledge and understanding was shared amongst everyone. The children were engaged in all discussions and Francis was very complimentary about the behaviour and maturity shown by the class. Well done Year 6.
