This week the children have:

- Drafted and improved their writing, organising their sentences into paragraphs.
- Written a final, neat copy of their non-chronological reports about Roman soldiers.
- Investigated and compared the area of rectilinear shapes.
- Designed, made, tested and evaluated a model Roman aqueduct.
- Discussed road safety rules.

Homework:

For their homework over half term, the children need to continue to learn their spellings, which is a list of more challenging homophones this week, as well as continue to practise their times tables and division facts. In class the children have been using a website called 'Hit The Button' which I highly recommend they use at home.

Those children who have scored full marks on their Rock Stars tests this week in either the 5 or 4 times tables will move to the related division facts. Those children who scored full marks in their division facts related to the 4 times table, will be tested on a mix of 4 times tables and division facts after half term.

Once again, thank you for your support with the creative homework this term. In the classroom, we now have a lovely display of replica Roman shields, helmets and swords, as well as mosaics, an aqueduct and booklets of Roman facts.
