This week the children have:

- Identified and talked about the descriptive words used in Elf Road.
- Created their descriptive sentences and written some fantastic similes.
- Planned their own story to match the structure of Elf Road.
- Used their spelling words to investigate adding suffixes to root words.
- Ordered and rounded decimals with one and two decimal places.
- Worked with equivalent fractions and decimals including tenths, hundredths, halves and quarters.
- Used classification keys to identify invertebrates found on our 'bug hunt' in the school grounds.
- Used the programme Scratch in their computing lesson.
- Learnt about the Jewish festival of Pesach.

## Homework:

As we have been learning about classifying different animals, including different vertebrates and invertebrates, I would like the children to select an animal of their choice and find out some interesting facts about *its appearance and characteristics*, *its diet and its habitat*.

Alternatively, they could make a model of the animal in its habitat adding some written facts. They can be as creative as they like! This homework needs to be named and is due on <u>before Friday 11<sup>th</sup> May</u>. We will then share their homework in class during the following week.
