#### SCIENCE WEEK

This year Lenham Primary celebrated Science week with lots of exciting experiments and visitors. We were lucky enough to successfully apply for £2000 from the Royal Society of Chemistry before Christmas, which allowed us to pay for new scientific equipment and a special visitor during Science week.

A big thank you first of all to all of the volunteers who gave up their time to visit the school and demonstrate experiments or talk to classes about their scientific background. In particular, Mrs Still and Dr Bratt were involved with several classes during the week. Thank you!

The children enthusiastically completed their own scientific experiments at home and brought them in to show their classmates and teachers. There were clearly lots of messy but fun experiments conducted-and of course lots of scientific discoveries! Well done to all who took part, and of course the winners.

Dr Bratt visited years 2-6 on the Tuesday and Wednesday to conduct exciting experiments proving that materials don't always behave as we'd expect. The children particularly enjoyed making non-Newtonian fluid using cornflour and water- something they can easily try at home if they'd wish.

Mr Berry visited us on Thursday to carry out even more experiments with all of the children. Year 6 enjoyed making their own chocolate and using a range of scientific equipment accurately, and Year 2 used their knowledge of forces to propel boxes across the hall.







Science week has been thoroughly enjoyable and informative for both students and staff- we are already looking forward to next year!

Mrs Culver would like to thank Miss Parry for organising the whole event and our visitors for giving up their time and inspiring our children in the wonderful world of science.

We have been lucky enough to receive letters, addressed to the school, from four Olympians, who recently competed at the Winter Olympics in South Korea. Cross-country skier **Andrew Musgrave**, snowboarder **Katie Ormerod**, freestyle skier **James Woods** and gold medallist in the skeleton, **Lizzy Yarnold**, have all expressed how much they appreciated the school's support during the games.
