We have had a busy second week in Year 4. Thank you so much if you managed to send your child in today dressed up for Roald Dahl day. It was great to see so many different costumes and smiley faces. This afternoon, the children enjoyed watching some of the original film adaptation of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory in celebration of Roald Dahl day, as well as writing their own descriptions of Willy Wonka in our English lesson.

This week the children have also:

- Built on their understanding of place value, working with four digit numbers and rounding to the nearest 10 and 100.
- Used adjectives and similes to alter and write a character description.

- Used their counting skills to count to 100 in French.
