

This week in Year 4 the children have:

- Continued learning about how to calculate the perimeter of rectangles and rectilinear shapes, including those with missing measurements.
- Used inference to answer comprehension questions about our King Midas story. They have also collected interesting words and phrases from the story and begun to plan their own version.
- Used apostrophes for singular and plural possession.
- Learnt about Greek democracy.
- Researched information about Greek Gods and Goddesses and presented their findings using headings, subheadings and other organisational features.
- Used their drawing skills to sketch features of Ancient Greek architecture and made their own model Ancient Greek columns.

Homework:

For their homework this week, the children have been set a Maths activity on the Active Learn website called 'Marching Madness' which will reinforce their understanding of calculating the perimeter of rectangles and rectilinear shapes. A homework club will run during Wednesday lunchtime for anyone unable to access the programme online.

As usual, the children also need to read for 20 minutes, ideally every night, and practise their spelling words and times table facts please. New spelling lists for this term were sent home on Tuesday and have also been uploaded onto the school website.
