This week the children have:

- Written their newspaper reports about the eruption of Mount Vesuvius, using facts within paragraphs, and direct and reported speech.
- Calculated and compared the area of rectilinear shapes.
- Found out what it is like to be a Hindu today, focussing on festivals and celebrations such as weddings and Holi.
- Designed their own road safety posters in PSHE.

After half term, our topic is called 'Water, Water Everywhere'. During the topic the children will:

- Use maps and atlases and learn about the physical features of rivers.
- Observe changes of state in Science and learn about solids, liquids and gases.
- Investigate the water cycle.

In Maths, the children will be learning about fractions, investigating equivalent fractions and comparing these as well as adding and subtracting two or more fractions. Later in the term, we move onto working with decimals. In English, we will be exploring the picture book 'Free Fall' as well as poetry and then narrative writing making use of dialogue and paragraphs.

## PE Days:

Next term, outdoor PE will be on a Monday afternoon and indoor will be on a Friday afternoon. Please can you make sure that PE kits are sent in to school on the first day back. As the weather can still be on the cold side, we ask that children have a tracksuit top and bottoms for outdoor PE as well as their normal shorts and a t-shirt.
