This week we have:

- Completed a full set of practice SAT Maths papers with amazing results well done Year 6!
- Completed our final versions of a persuasive brochure for Camp Green Lake.
- Completed a reading comprehension assessment.
- Investigated structures used to build bridges.
- Discussed the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain why shadows have the same shape as the object that casts them.

- Completing a SPAG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) assessment paper to review what we have mastered so far!

Homework:

Well done to all of the children for completing their **American State Topic** homework. Today, we shared them in class and it was clear how much time and effort had gone into producing them. We will be creating a display of the work and over the next week will be uploading photos of the work onto our class blog.

For **Maths** homework this week, the children have been asked to complete a worksheet focusing on adding and subtracting fractions. To be successful with this task the children will need to find a common denominator before they add or subtract. This homework is due for completion by **Thursday 28**th **November.**

For **English** this week, the children have a **Grammar worksheet** focusing on word class. A help sheet has been included just in case the children have forgotten the definition of each word class. **This sheet is due in by Thursday 28th November.**
