Virtual PE Competition



Jenny Brenchley who works at a school in Bearsted took some eggs to give to their key worker children. A parent at Jenny's school called Ellen Ridley arranged food bags for vulnerable families in Bearsted, so some were donated to her to give out in the food bags.

A few eggs were also given to a lady called Lara Sams from Harrietamites, who was making some lovely parcels for the care home in Harrietsham and also one in Bearsted. They were delighted with their parcels.

Also Lorraine Humphrey (parent of William and on PTA) who works as a Nurse for the NHS, who visits very sick children at their homes took eggs to give to the children and their families. Her colleagues gave them out too to the children they visit as well. We also gave some to Lorraine to take to some of the other nurses to give to theirchildren. Told them how amazing they all are.

There are a few neighbours shielding and a couple of families with children so I have cheered them up and dropped them off to their houses.
