On Friday 10 July at 10am, the Prime Minister will be giving an address to all school leavers which will be broadcast on Facebook and YouTube.


We hope that he will remember to include all those in year 6!

Hello Lenham Primary! For home school, we did science and made our own play dough in lovely colours using different foods to dye them.

If you want to try you will need......

For each different coloured batch, mix in this order:

2 cups of plain flour.

1/2 cup of salt.

2 tablespoons of vegetable oil.

2 tablespoons of cream of tartar.

1 cup of boiling water (ask a grown up to help!) with whatever natural dye you want to use already added - see below.

A few drops of glycerine (optional to make stretchier and shinier).

Colours are:

Yellow - Turmeric Brown - coffee Pink - strawberries

Purple - red cabbage Green - matcha tea powder

For the above dissolve/ mash up in the boiling water to make dye and use a sieve to remove any lumpy bits.

Cream - Avocado stones.

These just need grinding in a food processor first. Or you can also get the same sort of colour by just using much less coffee than with the brown.

Blue - This is most fun!.....

You need to LEAVE OUT the cream of tartar from the play dough this time as otherwise it has a funny reaction with the bicarbonate of soda and won't work properly!

Just add 1 teaspoon of bicarbonate of soda to a separate cup of your red cabbage purple water and watch it go fizzy and turn to blue!

Some other ideas are blueberries & beetroot! What else could you try?? How do they all smell? What is your favourite? From Poppy in Class 3
