TEACHING AND LEARNING SHOWCASE

Year R

We started this term exploring Autumn. We went for a breezy Autumn walk around the school grounds spotting signs of Autumn and collecting leaves to make a Leaf man.

Finally, we made Mrs Martin and Mrs Miller very proud in our Prickly Hay Nativity, and we loved performing it for our delighted parents!



Year 3

Year 3 have had a blast in the past!

We have been travelling 'Through the Ages', exploring and learning so much about how people lived and the changes that happened.

We started by becoming Stone Age inventors to make tools for cutting, mashing and peeling vegetables using only natural materials.







Class 3 really enjoyed becoming 'archaeology detectives' to examine secret evidence files about Skara Brae.





We have completed timelines to map the chronology and events of the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age and discovered so much about how the people and the world changed thousands of years ago!

In Art, we explored Stone Age cave paintings and drew our own to decorate our book corner.



We sketched, designed and created our own Bell Beaker Pottery- They all looked amazing!



















In English, we explored and wrote our own Stone Age diamante poems, learning the techniques and patterns for this genre. We also wrote some fantastic descriptive sentences based on the adventure story- Stone Age Boy.






Year 4 This term year 4 have been learning about the digestive system!

They started the term with a visit from the dentist:





They made sandwich board- style wearable digestive systems...




They used Weetabix to recreate how digestion works (including tights to represent the intestines!)





Here is a knitted digestive system that year 4 used to learn the scientific words for our digestive organs:





Part of the topic was also learning about teeth and how to keep them healthy. Year 4 used plaque revealing tablets to learn about tooth hygiene:





Class 5 have enjoyed lots of science this term with reversible and irreversible changes (fountain of Gold), dissolving sugar to saturation point, making circuits and finding out the properties of different samples from Alchemy Island. They have used the Periodic Table to identify the scientific symbols for Gold (Au), iron (Fe) and other elements.







They have also improved their mapwork skills by finding routes across Alchemy Island using 6-figure grid references and recognising contour lines as indicators of slope.








ICT has also been enjoyable this term and the children have used programming to make routes around Alchemy Island, created game boards and artistically enhanced photographs to give the effect of magical portals. They loved creating their own avatars to place on the map of Alchemy Island.





This term's topic has been 'A Child's War' and what a busy term it has been! The children have enjoyed a WW2 Evacuee experience day, with fantastic costumes on show, and received letters from home which they then replied to. They tasted mashed potato chocolate spread (it's not as bad as it sounds) and vinegar cake (which luckily didn't taste of vinegar).





Year 6 have excelled themselves in DT this term and shown such creativity in designing and making their own mini Anderson shelters. After constructing a wooden frame, the children used a range of materials to create their finished shelters which look amazing.



In their English lessons, the children have produced blackout poetry, short stories which describe an air raid in the Blitz and diaries in role as evacuees. They have also used their research skills to learn about The Battle of Britain, propaganda, rationing and the life of Anne Frank. If that wasn't enough, they have even created their own WW2 themed websites using Google Sites and used circuits in science to send messages in Morse Code!





The term ended with Year 6 showcasing their learning in their class assembly. Fantastic job, Year 6!

Next term, we travel to the polar regions for our Frozen Kingdoms topic.

Children in Need 2021


