TEACHING AND LEARNING SHOWCASE

Year R This term our first topic was 'Dangerous Dinosaurs'. We really enjoyed learning all about the different Dinosaurs; herbivores carnivores and even omnivores! We discussed why Dinosaurs had spikes, plates and horns and what they ate. We enjoyed our Palaeontologist role-play and small world dino land!






In our play we made Dino feet, fossils and junk modelled our own prehistoric creatures!



We really loved having a visit from the Maidstone Museum who taught how fossils are formed and how to create our own using clay!



We loved **World Book Day**, dressing up as our favourite characters and meeting a real-life author.



Science Week was jam packed full or exploration and investigation! We learnt how sound travels and made our own telephones. We planted seeds and predicted which ones would grow the quickest. We made exploding volcanoes and mixed colours together trialling different combinations, our own bubble machines and even a Kerplunk game!




Our last topic of this term was '**Puddles and Rainbows'**. We have loved discussing and spotting signs of Spring, learning why it rains and how weather is different all around the world. We made some fantastic Rainmakers and creative artwork including still life flowers and puddle pictures. We even wrote our own class version of 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear what do you see?' By Eric Carle.





And finally, we have been lucky enough to enjoy some amazing new resources in our outdoor area, giant foam Numicon and a weaving frame.



'Brilliant Bubbles' let us investigate if bubbles could be different sizes, shapes or colours!



'**Speed Scooters**' was an investigation into the best surface for the longest distance to travel with one push.



'What can our hands do?' was an investigation into our sense of touch. Using blindfolds, we tested if we could count objects, do simple puzzles, order straws from the longest to shortest, and test different temperatures. Our hands are incredible things!



At the end of the week, we answered the question, 'Where does bread come from?' -No, not the Co-op! We had a special treat when Mrs McCluskey came and helped us bake bread! What a surprise when the yeast 'woke up' and the dough magically grew overnight!



Thank you to Fiona in the kitchen for popping it in the oven for us, it was delicious!



Lastly, we took care of poor Otto when he caught Chicken Pox. Thank you, Class 1, for looking after him so well when he was poorly.



Year 2 This term our topic was 'The Scented Garden'. In Art, we've had lots of fun creating some daffodil and tulip observational drawings. In Science, we explored and labelled the structure of plants, grew our own cress and used our senses to smell and compare different herbs! In English, we have created our own non-chronological report about different plants, written our own version of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and created some fantastic setting descriptions to describe the garden in 'The Green Ship' by Quentin Blake.



We had a great time dressing up as our favourite book characters for World Book Day and enjoyed a visit from the 'Bird Man'. We also made our own fruit kebabs in one of our 'Healthy Me' PSHE lessons.



During Term 4, we also took part in Science Week 2022! We created our own string telephones, completed some CREST science experiments (sniffly sneezes and tea bag trouble) AND enjoyed a forest school session with Miss Bishop! What a busy term!



Year 3

This term we continued our Predator! Topic- having a lot of fun and learning so much more about our living world.



We were visited by Alan from Eagle Heights bird sanctuary along with special guests: Cybil the Sparrow Hawk, Alaska the Bald Eagle and Sparky the Barn Owl. We had an amazing time learning

so many fascinating facts about these predatory birds!





We took part in a WWF Webinar on Tiger conservation. We all learnt some amazing facts about tigers from a real 'Tiger-Expert'!

When exploring the flight of a peregrine falcon and drawing aerial maps using google earth, we found a live stream of some nesting falcons in Sheffield. The children were so excited and have asked to watch them every day to follow the progress of their (newly-laid) eggs.



We investigated 'What do owls eat?' we all thoroughly enjoyed the gruesome discovery of animal bones, insects and fur by dissecting owl pellets.





Our Topic has been completed by exploring the role of skeletons and muscles in humans and animals- We still need some practise but it was a lot of fun!

Our English has focused on the Narrative: The Crow's Tale and we have constructed descriptive pieces using sentence stacking sessions to learn to



use a plethora of grammatical features including onomatopoeia, alliteration, similes, conjunctions and dialogue. We particularly enjoyed the drama activities on our experience days.




World Book Day: We enjoyed dressing up as book characters, completing a book scavenger hunt with Yr4 and listening to our visiting author.





In Maths, we continued developing our understanding of multiplication and division methods, including learning about scaling. We have then explored counting, using and calculating with money.





We have had a great time in PE with Mr Holliday as well-playing a range of games from the Paralympics including Boccai, sitting volleyball, curling and blind football. We have also enjoyed playing netball in our outdoor sessions.



During this year's Science Week, we explored keeping



healthy and the role of exercise by turning parts of our school grounds into an outdoor gym.



We also investigated Clever creatures and conducted experiments into how and why creatures and animals camouflage themselves.





We finished off our amazing week by completing the Stack'em engineering challengedemonstrating some excellent team skills!







The next part of our Eddie's and Ellie's Wild Adventure project supported by Thakeham housing involved another visit from Sarah to run some exciting reading and drama activities. We will be looking forward to our trip out in Term 6!

Year 4

Our topic this term has been 'Traders and Raiders' focused on the Anglo-Saxons and the Viking invasions.

We started the topic by building Viking ships using only PE equipment:




We also more recently had a Viking experience day, with a Viking feast and a lesson translating Viking runes:





We have written Viking sagas in English lessons, and retold the creation of Asgard using role play:



In PE, we have been learning how to play golf!



We also had lots of fun in Science week, carrying out investigations using chromatography and designing birds' nests for stability:







We were soon into the science and carried out an investigation to identify how many worms there were in our school field. We calculated the area of the school field (12,904 m^2) and multiplied it by the number of worms per m^2 . Total = 851,664 worms.








We also searched the grounds for small creatures (arthropods, nematods, annelids insects). We made different environments (dark, damp, light, airy, cool, warm etc) and found investigated which is the chosen habitat for woodlice. We made bug hotels with the information we had found out.



For art & design we have been improving our drawing through feedback from our friends and using collage materials. Here are our butterflies.





We travelled over 6000 miles to virtually visit The Galapagos Islands, one of the locations visited by Darwin, to discover the unique flora and fauna native to these volcanic islands. In English, we have been drafting on our own persuasive Galapagos holiday brochures which we have been working hard to publish this week.

Darwin used his diary to record his sketches of the species he observed and so we mirrored this in our own artwork.



We had great fun during Science Week, with our Forest School afternoon with Miss Bishop being a real highlight. Thank you, Miss Bishop!



Our engineering skills were put to the test when we were asked to design and make a boat that would hold 25 pennies for a minimum of 10 seconds.



Did smaller or larger dinosaurs lose heat quicker? We simulated this through the use of small, medium and large bottles of warm water.



We also found out about 'surprising stains' and the colour changes that took place when we added other solutions and liquids such as lime juice, vinegar, and soap.



Of course, we cannot forget our final World Book Day at primary school where we donned our finest book character costumes! Zumba with a giant dancing dinosaur was a sight to behold! As well as enjoying paired reading with Year 1, we also made some terrific book recommendations.


