

Intent:

Music is planned in-line with the statements laid out in the national curriculum. Cross-curricular links are made where possible using Cornerstones, with Charanga being used to supplement and provide extra support and resources to enhance music teaching.

Aims:

To engage and inspire pupils to develop a love of music and their talent as musicians, increasing their self-confidence, creativity and sense of achievement.

Objectives:

To perform, listen to, review and evaluate music across a range of historical periods, genres, style and traditions, including the works of the great composers and musicians.

To learn to sing and to use their voices, to create and compose music on their own and with others, have the opportunity to learn a musical instrument and use technology appropriately.

To understand and explore how music is created, produced and communicated including through: pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo, timbre, texture, structure and appropriate musical notations
