Message from Mrs McCluskey


As we wrap up this term (and quite a few presents!) I want to celebrate the wonderful moments that have made this festive season so special in our school.

Governors also heard from the children about the new assemblies and the social groups to support anxiety and neurodiversity. The children spoke so confidently about their peers as well as their own experiences.


